







































Munich Part II

After many frustrating experiences in the pursuit of returning to Korea, I had completely quit my aspirations to teach. Many schools and recruiters telling me I'm too old. That idea makes no sense to me, as a big point of school is to learn from the wisdom of others in which only time can grant. So I apologized to the people who pushed me to re-explore the Chinese frontier and signed the contract when I found out that it was still available. I still have to successfully get a visa in time, however the way it seems now is that I'll be starting with a year in Guiyang. I'm not sure how much I can post with respects to the Chinese government and the dynamics or politics of my job and life there, so at least I'll try to stay updated on other travels and individually. I may keep a diary or just write another album.

Some other fun things I did recently. Movie nights with *Paradise Hills* and *Ford v Ferrari*. The former is quite an odd trip. Somewhat unsettling and disturbing, though not sure I'd deter a viewing. The latter is a "not to be missed". These lead actors are almost 100% and the story is true. Additionally I took some Master Classes with Tom Morello. I had no idea about his personality. He really tells us everything about his sound, effects and riff writing. I once saw him in a bar in my hometown we share and regretfully could only comment on his hat, so these educational recordings are very meaningful. Really though I just like getting to know them better because in real life I don't think it would be possible.

December 26, 2024




Veganuary

I had the Shakira show to go to and was so tired after walking back to the hotel from Camping World Stadium.




So I decided not to check out the midnight offering, also weighed by budget concerns for finishing the album.




Set It Up


"My Empire of Dirt"

As you recall the rain wouldn't stop before I left and there were times I felt I should've ditched the ticket, yet all the sacrifices were reasons I held on to the experience. Boys Noize started playing at the opposite end of the main stage. The crowd was playing it overly cool and most acted like they didn't even know Alexander Ridha (real-life name) was a superstar in his own right. I noticed he even fumbled a couple beats to show us he was actually playing live. 

I was seeking a bit more about using The Matrix, so I viewed another segment by DnC Music. He delivered a couple more pointers and set the table for a chill vibe. I'm still figuring things out by studying the manual and testing, while practicing or somewhat composing. I finally was able to control my main drum machine plugin (Battery 4 by Native Instruments) using the percussion presets, however the night before I decided to order an Akai MPC Studio 2 for better feel and control. There was one of those new but damaged packaging, open-box type deals on Amazon which put it at a decent discount. Hopefully it's what I'm looking for to help with production of beats and grooves. Last night I found my way to the gym again and listened to the most recent Tiësto mix which can be found on Acast. I think catching up with some of the mix masters I listened to after teaching internationally is an overdue task I'll find helpful moving forward.

This past week has been strange work with a little fruit. I basically spent a ton of time obsessing about microphones to find the right deals to help get the studio operational. Since I traded my only Shure away (not only mic) along with a drum machine towards the MicroFreak, I realized I was going to be a bit short of capabilities for multi-tracking. I am still trying to focus on mastering audio, however when reading the mastering book from Super 8 by Wyndham Ormond Beach a while ago, my love of engineering started to spark a new flame. When I was younger, I always went for top shelf everything and eventually ended up like an non-famous MC Hammer. So I must try to find the best bang for the buck and try to remember what I've learned in both respects. eBay often feels like gambling, however I was scouring that site and many others, eventually ending up with two Blue Bluebirds (Blue being a completely retired name for microphones at this point). Not the Latvian made ones, nor the later Logitech stuff, so we'll see. JZ still makes microphones in Latvia and this video by Justin Colletti of SonicScoop is very informative and revealing about some of their selections and frequency responses in general. The progress on the Akai MPC Studio MKII is good and I've decided to keep it despite my initial frustrations, which I think many people share about their DAW within a DAW if using for session work. I have needed a change of workflow however and it forces me to think differently and separate the groove-making somewhat, while still giving the option to control other virtual instruments.

Moving past that I went back to the gym a few times and listened to some more podcasts on Podbean. Nora En Pure is in state this weekend doing shows in both Orlando and Jacksonville on the same day before going up to NYC for a festival. I really wanted to go to one and decided to check her out while doing the StairClimber. It was beautiful and inspiring as I always remember, but she threw in an f* bomb sample towards the end. I almost didn't notice because some person who just finished their workout distracted me, but then I was like I have to forget about that Nora show and save some money. Later I found the best mix of all those so far and that is – Protocol Radio 687. My biggest issue working out at Planet Fitness was that I noticed a sign that I started to worry I'm becoming an enemy of this on the blog. I'm always trying to be constructive with any reviews, though some newer generations are being so explicit and careless that I typically feel the responsibility to warn or just avoid if possible. One phrase I remember growing up was, "If you can't say anything nice, don't say anything at all." There are definitely exceptions to staying quiet

and I'm struggling with that battle of standing up for myself or filling up with rage. Anyways I think I understand the context and my intentions in reviews are usually balanced. Knowing many perspectives of quality has to be one blessing of not necessarily being super-successful as a performer or otherwise star in the limelight.


